The MFA degree in Visual Arts offers students the opportunity to explore art history, theory, pedagogy and criticism in depth along with a hands-on studio practice. This combination of theoretical study with studio experience gives students a holistic understanding of research and studio practice.

Program or Degree Title: Master of Fine Arts in Visual Arts

The MFA degree is a low-residency R U Q R U 160-credit plan of study emphasizing visual arts and the creative process of generating new works that are grounded in theory.

The MFA at JU nurtures the development of more rigorous and refined relationships between theory, pedagogy and the studio practice.
